

[Disasters (Earthquakes, Typhoons, Floods)]

I. Natural Disasters That Could Affect Hikone City And Surrounding Areas

Earthquake: Japan lies on multiple fault lines, and a major earthquake could strike at any time. Typhoon: Typhoon season in Japan typically runs from July to October.

A powerful typhoon could make landfall in Hikone during this period.

Flooding: Several rivers in Hikone flow into Lake Biwa. In the event of a torrential downpour or similar conditions, these rivers could overflow and cause flooding.

Heavy Snow: Heavy snow can hamper traffic, damage houses, and trigger other types of disasters. When extreme winter weather is forecast, please stay alert to potential risks.

Be sure to stock up on food and basic necessities in case of utility outages or infrastructure damage.

NTT Disaster Emergency Message 171

NTT Disaster Emergency Message Dial 171 is a service that allows people to leave and check voice messages when regular phone communication is disrupted during a large-scale disaster. The 171 service can be accessed from landlines, public phones, and certain other types of phones, but it cannot be used from overseas.

·How To Prepare A Go Bag (a bag packed with emergency supplies)

Pack essential items in a backpack in preparation for the unexpected. Make sure to store your go-bag in a place at home where you can grab it quickly in case of a sudden evacuation.

Legal Alias	Registered foreign nationals are allowed to adopt an alias, also known as a second legal name. To register your legal alias, you must prove that the alias is already in use in public contexts by providing documents such as mail, bills, and similar items sent under that alias. Please note that once an alias is formally registered, it will be very difficult to make any changes.
Katakana Name Registration	Once you successfully register your name in Katakana, it will appear in the remarks section of your resident certificate.
Inkan (personal seal) Registration	Hikone residents aged 15 and older can register their Inkan. However, only one Inkan can be registered per person. Upon completion of the Inkan registration at the city hall, an Inkan registration card will be issued. This card is required each time you request an Inkan registration certificate from the city. An Inkan registration certificate is generally required for transactions such as purchasing a house or a car. If you have registered an alias or Katakana name, you can register an Inkan under that alias or Katakana name.
My Number (Individual Numbers)	 My Number Card A 12-digit ID number is issued to all residents of Japan regardless of nationality. A plastic My Number Card shows your name, home address, date of birth, sex, and your 12-digit My Number. You can also use your My Number card as your photo ID. Once your My Number card is ready to be issued, a notice will be mailed to you. For further details, please contact Hikone City Hall. *The expiration date of your My Number Card is usually the same as the expiration date of your residency status. Once your residency status is renewed, be sure to update your My Number card as soon as possible. *If you intend to use your My Number Card while residing abroad, please notify the local government office before leaving Japan. Issuance Services of Government-Issued Certificates at a Convenience Store You can obtain the following certificates at a convenience store using your My Number Card. Birth Registration	You must complete a birth registration within 14 days after your baby is born. *If you need to register the birth with the Immigration Services Agency, you are required to submit a photocopy of the birth registration form and complete the necessary procedures within 30 days after the baby is born.
Death Registration	Within 7 days of receiving a death notification signed by a doctor, please report the person's death to your local government office. If the city hall is closed, you can still complete the death registration at the security guard's office.

Proof of Employment Separation (e.g., a certificate of unemployment, certificate of resignation, etc.), Name Seal (*necessary if submitting a letter of attorney), Photo Identification (e.g., a residence card, a My Number card, etc.) Bankbook and Name Seal for Bank Procedures (*required for NHI premiums payments by direct debit).

National Health Insurance	It is compulsory for all residents of Japan to be covered by health insurance, with a few exceptions. As for foreign nationals, those who have legal status to reside in Japan for more than 3 months under the Immigration Control Act are required to enroll in a health insurance plan. Please note that you must complete the necessary procedures at the city hall to withdraw from the National Health Insurance (NHI) system once you obtain employer-sponsored health insurance (Shakai Hoken) or another type of health insurance. If you want to switch back to the National Health Insurance system, you will also need to complete the necessary procedures at the city hall and submit proof of employment separation. After enrolling in Japan's National Health Insurance system, you will receive a paper National Health Insurance card, or, if you have integrated your NHI with your My Number Card, you will receive an NHI eligibility verification letter. Be sure to carry your health insurance card with you whenever you visit a doctor. Japan's universal health care system allows all insured individuals to pay a portion (generally 30%) of the total medical expense each time (terms and conditions apply). Those covered by the NHI can also undergo an annual mass health check-up, etc., at little or no cost.

In addition to taxes, if you are enrolled in the National Health Insurance system and/or the Japanese Long-Term Care Insurance system, be sure to pay your insurance premiums on time. Please be aware that if you fail to pay your taxes or insurance premiums on time and leave them unpaid, you will be charged late fees and handling fees. In the worst-case scenario, the city may take legal action to seize your assets, including your income, property, or other valuables.

If you are having difficulty paying your tax or insurance bills, contact the Credit Management Division as soon as possible to arrange a payment plan.

Before your baby turns two months old, a set of documents regarding childhood immunizations and medical questionnaires for each vaccination will be mailed to you. These documents and questionnaires are available in English, Portuguese, Vietnamese, and Chinese. Please contact the Health Promotion Division to receive the translated version. To have your baby or young child vaccinated, you must first schedule an appointment with a health facility. Under the Japanese Childhood Immunization Act, all recommended vaccines are provided free of charge. However, if the vaccinations are not administered on time, parents will be required to cover the cost of each vaccine.

Cancer Screening

Regular cancer screenings are crucial for detecting signs of cancer as early as possible.

The table below provides details of the cancer screening tests offered by the city:

· Health Check-up

What is included in a health check-up?

Body measurements (height, weight, BMI), chest circumference for people aged under 74, blood pressure for people aged under 74, urinalysis, internal medicine, blood tests, and so on.

- *Echocardiography and Ophthalmoscopy (a test to view the inside of the back of the eye) are available for individuals aged 40 to 74, under certain conditions.
- *Anemia testing is available only for individuals under 74 who have been advised by a physician to undergo testing.
- *Hepatitis screening is available only for individuals under 40 who have not yet undergone hepatitis screening.

For more information, please contact the Hikone Health Promotion Division.

Health check-up and cancer screening fees will be waived for those who meet any of the following conditions.

- Tax-Exempt Households
- *Apply to the Health Promotion Division at least one week before your check-up date, or apply online at least two weeks before your check-up date.
- Those living under the Seikatsu Hogo Welfare Program.
- *Please notify your caseworker at least one week before your check-up date.
- Those aged 65 and older with certain disabilities who possess a card or eligibility certificate for the health care system for older seniors.
- •Those who received tickets for the health check-up at no cost or tickets for the free hepatitis virus test.
- •Those aged 70 and older on the day of their health check-up.

3. Neighborhood Association

Jichikai or Chokai is a neighborhood association made up of residents living in the same area, town, or housing complex. These associations organize community activities that help people interact and build connections within their local area. In addition to hosting events, each neighborhood association is responsible for tasks such as neighborhood clean-ups, emergency drills, and other initiatives aimed at keeping the area safe and welcoming. Joining a neighborhood association offers an opportunity to become more familiar with your surroundings and get to know your neighbors. Membership typically involves a modest monthly fee, which is used to maintain neighborhood safety and cleanliness and to support events and activities for local residents.

- 4. Basic Procedures At A Bank And Japan Post Office
 - •To open a bank account, you need to visit a bank with your photo ID and personal name seal. You may also be asked to present your My Number card during the account opening process.





You will receive a bankbook and a cash card at the end of the procedure.

• Before you move to a new place, make sure to request the relocation/forwarding service at a Japan Post office. This service is called "Tenkyo Tensou Service" in Japanese. Under this service, postal items sent to the former address will be redirected to the new address free of charge for one year after your moving date.



·Postal Money Order Called "Teigaku Kogawase"

When you apply for a government-issued certificate, etc. by post, you are usually required to pay using a Teigaku Kogawase. A Teigaku Kogawase is a fixed-amount money order, and you can purchase it at a Japan Post office. It is commonly used in Japan for transactions, so it is helpful to know where to purchase one.

[What To Do When You Need A Certificate From Another Municipality (Other Than Hikone)]

If you need to obtain a government-issued certificate, such as a tax certificate, from your previous municipality, you can apply for various types of certificates by mail.

[General Steps:]

- I. Visit the official website of your previous municipal government and download the application form.
- 2. Fill out the form, prepare a return envelope with your current address and the proper postage, make a photocopy of your identification, and purchase a Teigaku Kogawase (fixed-amount postal money order) for payment.
- 3. Enclose the completed application form, return envelope, photocopy of identification, and the Teigaku Kogawase in an envelope, and mail it from a Japan Post office.

Please note that it takes a week or more for your previous municipality to check your application and mail the certificate to your current address. If you are unsure about the procedure, make sure to contact your previous municipal government for more details.



Hikone City designates specific garbage bags for each type of trash. These designated garbage bags are available for purchase at grocery stores, DIY stores, convenience stores, and other retail locations throughout the city.

4. When You Want To Discard Bulky Waste And/Or Small Appliances
Bulky waste, such as large furniture, blankets, bicycles, and household appliances exceeding one meter in
height, width, and length, can be disposed of at the Seiso Center for a fee. Generally, there are three methods
for disposing of bulky waste as defined below: A, B and C.

A Bringing Bulky Waste Directly to the Seiso Center

In this case, please drive slowly to the gate of the center, stop, and speak to the worker there. The worker will weigh the bulky waste you have brought on the car scale at the gate. Based on the total weight, you will be informed of the disposal fee, which must be paid before exiting the center.

B. Pre-Paid Pick-up Service *Available for Hikone residents only.

- (1) Measure large garbage (e.g., tables, closets, futon mattresses) you want to dispose of.
- 2 Call the Seiso center at 0749-22-2734, and request the bulky waste pick-up service. You need to provide at least the following information:
 - ·Where you want center workers to pick up the bulky waste.
 - Your telephone number.
 - ·What type of waste you want to dispose of and the size of each bulky waste.
- (3) You will be informed of the day and time the center workers will pick up your bulky waste, and the amount of prepaid stickers (shown at the bottom of this page) you need to buy in advance. *Depending on which district of Hikone you live in, the available pick-up day differs.
- 4 Purchase the required amount of prepaid stickers, called "Sodai Gomi Shori Ken" in Japanese, at the Hikone Living Environment Division, each branch office, or at authorized supermarkets and drugstores.
- (5) Attach all pre-paid stickers to each bulky waste item, and leave them at the appointed pick-up spot no later than 8:00 AM on the scheduled day.

C. Landfill Waste Pick-up Request Via LINE

In addition to requesting the city's landfill waste pick-up service by phone, you can also make a request anytime, year-round through the mobile messaging app "LINE." The images below show which icon to select in the app.



[Important Notes]

- · Please schedule your landfill waste collection request at least a few weeks in advance.
- The maximum number of items you can dispose of as landfill is five each time.

 If you want to throw away more than five items, please do so on separate days.
- · Once tickets for the landfill waste pick-up are purchased, they cannot be refunded.
